



## Dublin Horse Show

### Puissance Competition

Up to six qualifying places will be available for the 2019 Land Rover Puissance for Irish riders not competing in the CSIO5\* classes at the Dublin Horse Show.

The top six placed horse and rider combinations in the Puissance qualifier will be invited to compete, provided they comply with FEI rules and those specified by the Organising Committee below:

- Horses competing at the qualifier must clear a height of 1.90m without faults (including refusals) twice.
- The combination as qualified must compete in Dublin unless a rider is out for medical reasons.
- The competition will be judged under FEI Rules Article 262.2, horses must be at least 7 years of age, and riders may not compete in the Puissance before the year in which they reach their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday.
- As the Puissance at the Dublin Horse Show will be an International competition, judged under FEI rules, all horses that qualify to compete must be presented for a Horse Inspection at the RDS Showgrounds.
- Vaccinations must be in line with current FEI requirements.
- All competing horses and riders must be registered with the FEI. (Forms and further details are available on the Horse Sport Ireland website). Horses which qualify to compete in the Puissance at the Dublin Horse Show must be registered with the FEI and hold a FEI passport.
- A maximum of 2 horses per rider will apply.
- There will be a prize fund of €4,000 at the qualifier. €3,000 to be provided by the RDS and €1,000 to be provided by the host Show.
- The prize money to be divided as follows; 1<sup>st</sup> €1,500, €1,000, 2<sup>nd</sup> €500, 3<sup>rd</sup> €500, 4<sup>th</sup> €500, 5<sup>th</sup> 500, 6<sup>th</sup> 500.
- Horse & Rider must be S.I.I Registered for 2019 to compete at Qualifier.
